



# D&T AND ART CHALLENGE NUMBER 7

## Perspective Drawing


- This link gives a little more information. Do not worry that it mentions GCSE on it! I think you can and should all attempt to complete this.

- We will be attempting single (one) point perspective
- Try follow my steps below to create the design.
- If you can do this I would like you to then try create other designs.
- I would advise you to draw your designs really lightly so you can easily erase mistakes. You can then go over the edges later to make them stand out.





1. Draw two parallel horizontal lines. Then measure it out and try write a word in a block letter style similar to how I wrote HENRY.




2. Choose one point up above the text. It can be either side. It can be as far away as you want it to be. Draw a little dot at this point. Then join the top corner of every letter to the dot.




3. Join every other corner of the letters to the dot. However stop as soon as the line hits the edge of a letter. See the drawing of the H as an example.




4. Now draw a horizontal line somewhere between the dot and the top of the writing.




5. Go over the lines at the top between the letters and the line to make them stand out.



6. This bit is difficult to explain in writing but take a look at the top line and see can you figure out what has happened with the H and the Y. See the two small pictures.



7. Go over the lines to make them stand out. Notice how I have gone over all the lines until they meet another line. See the E as an example.



8. You can add shading and patterns to your designs to make them stand out. Use fineliners, markers or what you think looks good.
